We will be holding Striker-Fire Challenge matches at PPC Range #2 on May 29th, July 31st, and October 30th (all on 5th Saturdays).

These matches are for centerfire, striker-fire guns only, and are lots of fun. No formal competition experience needed.

You can compete in either or both of two gun classes: Stock (iron sights only) and Open (red dots allowed). We will be running 4 relays starting at 9:00 AM. Shoot all 4 relays if you like, pending availability of shooting positions.

Cost is \$10 per relay fired. Awards will be determined using the Lewis Classification System.

A match will consist of several stages where shooters will navigate the stage while engaging targets with rifle, shotgun, and pistol. A wide range of targets are utilized, such as paper, steel, clays, bowling pins, moving/spinning targets, etc. The stages are always different, but you can always expect something fun and challenging.

Our next 3 Gun match will be held Sunday July 18th on the 100-yard rifle range, tactical range, and shotgun patterning range. Those ranges will be closed to normal member use during the match.

CLUB GROUNDS ARCHERY HUNT

There will be an archery hunt this year just like we have done in the past. The drawing for the hunt will take place Wednesday June 23rd at 7:00. For the hunt the club is divided into 4 hunting zones and you will have a zone to yourself for a week of the season. You don't need to be present for the drawing, but if you are and your name gets picked you can select which week and hunting zone you prefer. If you are not present and your name is picked you will be assigned a week and zone. This year I will allow hunters to have a proxy attend the drawing if the hunter cannot be there. The hunter must tell me in advance who the proxy is. The hunt is open to all current HH&A members (bring your membership card to the drawing) and is an antlered or antlerless hunt, provided you have the proper tags for WMU 5B. There will be a \$10 non-refundable fee to register for the hunt (no fee for Jr. hunters). The fee must be paid before the drawing occurs. Anyone that registers but does not pay the fee will not be included in the drawing.

Without the brilliant planning and heroic sacrifices of the D-Day invasion, the Allies may have never defeated the Nazi forces in Europe.

In the 1950s, when it seemed certain that Alaska would be admitted to the Union, designers began retooling the American flag to add a 49th star to the existing 48. Meanwhile, a 17-year-old Ohio student named Bob Heft borrowed his mother's sewing machine, disassembled his family's 48-star flag and stitched on 50 stars in a proportional pattern. He handed in his creation to his history teacher for a class project, explaining that he expected Hawaii would soon achieve statehood as well. Heft also sent the flag to his congressman, Walter Moeller, who presented it to President Eisenhower after both new states joined the Union. Eisenhower selected Heft's design, and on July 4, 1960, the president and the high school student stood together as the 50-star flag was raised for the first time. Heft's teacher promptly changed his grade from a B- to an A. (History.com)

All members are encouraged to reacquaint themselves with all the rules and safety protocols.


