Vice-President's Pen

It's summer and the days are longer, so we are seeing increased activity on our ranges. We must all keep safety in mind and a review of the basic safety rules is a good idea.

- (1) Always keep the gun (or bow) pointed in a safe direction.
- (2) Always keep the finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- (3) Always keep the firearm unloaded until ready to use it.
 - (4) Know your target and what is beyond it.
- (5) Make sure that unauthorized persons, especially children can not get access to your firearms.
- (6) Make sure that your gun is in proper working order and safe to shoot.
- (7) Only use the correct ammunition for your firearm.
- (8) Use an Empty Chamber Indicator (ECI) for benched guns if you have to go forward of the firing line.

HHA is a members only club. Guests must have a guest pass and be accompanied by a club member. Only paper targets are permitted on club ranges unless the club provides other targets. Absolutely no shooting after official sunset on the outdoor ranges. When there is more than one member shooting on a range, shoot together, check targets together. No handling of firearms when someone is forward of a firing line. Pick up your brass and put it in the provided buckets unless you want to take it with you. Take only your brass. Bulk brass helps support our youth programs. In order to use the indoor handgun range, you must qualify. See elsewhere in the Newsletter for a list of contacts to qualify.

Be a safe and responsible firearms owner. Set a good example for others. Take a non-shooter to the range and help them enjoy the shooting sports. That goes a long way towards protecting and preserving our Second Amendment Rights.

POLICE PISTOL COMBAT (PPC) MATCHES

Our matches will run monthly on the first Saturdays through October, at PPC Range #2. Match dates are as follows:

- August 2
- September 6
- October 4

We will have 5 Gun Classes to shoot in and will run 5 relays per match date, as long as we have enough shooters. Cost is \$5 per relay.

Shoot as many relays as you like, pending availability of space. A minimum of 50% of fees taken in will be paid back as cash awards to winners using the Lewis Classification System. Each Gun Class will be handled separately for awards.

An end of season award raffle (gift cards and/or shooting accessories) will be drawn in November for those shooting more than 10 relays during the season.

On match days, the security gate opens and range setup/registration will begin at 8:00 a.m. Safety briefing at 8:50 a.m. Hammer down at 9:00 a.m. We are usually done by noon. Note: At the June, July, and August matches, we will start 30 minutes earlier, so the 'early bird' shooters can get an extra relay in.

We run a cold range. Do not bring loaded guns to the range. Guns must remain unloaded and holstered or cased, except when under the direction of the range officer on the firing line, or when in a safe gun handling area.

Please come and join us for some fun. Bring a shooting friend with you. Our matches are open to the public. Beginners are welcome. It will be nice to see everyone again!

NOMINATION OF CLUB OFFICERS & DIRECTORS

Nominees must have been a club member in good standing for two years in order to be nominated. The election will be held at our November 4th meeting.

SUMMER PISTOL LEAGUE

The HH&A 2025 Summer Pistol League (Bullseye) runs from 6:30 - 8:30 p.m. every Wednesday evening now through August 20th at our Outdoor Pistol Range.

The one-time League Registration fee is \$10 for the 1st gun, and \$5 for a 2nd gun (optional). Match fees are \$1.00 per relay. Includes 3 targets: 1 Slow Fire, 1 Timed Fire, and 1 Rapid Fire.

Four relays are held each evening, weather permitting. Shoot as many as you like.

Course of fire is the 30-shot National Match Course. All targets are shot with one hand at 25 yards using turning targets.

Any safe rimfire or centerfire semi-auto pistol or revolver (.32 to 45 caliber) may be used. Both iron sights and red dot optics are allowed. Bring your own stapler, staples, pasters/tape, pencil or pen, and empty chamber indicator (ECI). Ear and eye protection are mandatory. Brass catchers may be used.

All scoring will be done by shooters downrange. Pass scorecards right, score left. Scores will be recorded and averaged for the league by gun class, and cash awards will be given out at the end of the season using Lewis Class.

Note: Two-handed shooting will be allowed, but scores will not be eligible for awards.

2025 2 GUN SCHEDULE

2 Gun is a fast paced competition in which the participant is required to safely navigate a course of fire while switching between rifle and pistol in a safe and fun atmosphere. This year we will be running three stages per match. The match fee will be \$20. Set-up will be the Saturday before each shoot, beginning at 2:00 pm. The match fee will be waived for anyone assisting with set-up. If you have one of these Saturdays free, please consider coming out to help. These matches are tough to put on for the small amount of staff that we have.

Schedule:

- August 31
- October 26

Gun Classes:

- Open Optic of choice allowed on pistol, multiple optics allowed on rifle
- Tac Ops Open sights only on pistol, one optic only allowed on rifle
- Armored Open rules apply to weapons, must wear a vest with ballistic plates
- PCC Pistol caliber carbine only, with no optic rules

Minimum caliber: 9mm for pistol, .223 for rifle

This is a fun and friendly competition. Scoring is time plus penalties. There are no prizes, and this is not a cumulative match. BB GUN NATIONALS

Fundraising: Thank you HHA, our sponsors and everyone for your tremendous support. Your generosity helped 7 shooters have a fantastic match and made so many memories that will stay with them for a lifetime.

Results: The team consisted of Giovanni Melendrez, Kennen Shaffer, Abigail Sowers, Grayson Wible and Connor Williams with alternates: Martin Birch and Grant Hess. The team placed 13th out of 59 teams. 17 states were represented. The shooters are broken down into team members, alternates and what is called the Champions match. The Champions are shooters that attended the previous year's nationals and are not eligible to be on a team for the current year as the rules state if you are a team member at nationals, you must skip a year before being a team member again. This does not apply to alternates. A grand combined total of 460 shooters competed, consisting of 294 team members, 107 alternates and 59 champions. Almost all of the team shooters were in the top 40% of 294 team shooters. The alternates were in the top 30% of 107 shooters. We did not have any shooters entered in the Champions match. Congratulations to Martin Birch for obtaining a perfect score on the test. He was only 1 of 20 to do this out of 460 shooters. That is impressive!!

66TH ANNUAL WALT WISE MEMORIAL POLICE PISTOL MATCH

- To be held at the Bullseye Pistol Range on September 20-21.
- Rain or shine, 60 covered firing points with turning targets.
- Two relays of Rim Fire 900 and Center Fire 900 matches each day for 1800 daily Aggregate and two-day 3600 Aggregate.
- Rim Fire matches are shot first, starting at 9:00 am. Center Fire matches follow lunch each day.
- All matches are shot at 25 yards, using turning Police-L targets.
- Course of Fire: Slow Fire, Police-L, Timed Fire, and Rapid Fire.
 Team matches are "paper matches", based on Police-L scores.
- Lewis Classification system used for determining awards in A, B, and C Classes.
- Cash awards for Individual matches and 2-person Team matches.
- Team trophies for Rim Fire and Center Fire 4-person Team matches.
- Camping available on-site. No electric or water hookups.
- Motels located nearby at Exit 72 of I-81.
- Breakfast and lunch available in the club commissary both days.
- Match program and directions to the club are on our website.
- Cost is \$25 for one 900 Individual match, \$35 for two, or \$50 for all four. Team matches are \$5 per shooter. Cost for special Walter Wise Commemorative Centerfire Revolver Match is \$5 per shooter.

STRIKER-FIRE CHALLENGE MATCHES

HH&A will be holding Striker-Fire Challenge combat pistol matches in 2025. No pre-registration is required. Just show up.

Match Dates: (last Saturday of the month)

- September 27
- October 25

Range set-up and on-site registration starts at 8:00 a.m., match rules and safety briefing at 8:45 a.m., relay 1 at 9:00 a.m.

Five continuous relays will be run at our Police Pistol Combat Range #2 from 9:00 a.m. until around noon. Cost is \$10 per relay. Fifty rounds are required per relay fired (40 for Concealed Carry).

Four Gun Classes will be used: Stock (Iron Sights only), Open (Optics allowed), Stock Concealed Carry (Iron sights Only), and Open Concealed Carry (Optics allowed). Maximum barrel lengths allowed are: 3.75" barrel for semi-autos, and 2.75" for revolvers. Two mags are needed per stage.

Shoot as many relays as you like (pending availability of space) in either or both Gun Classes. Cash awards for each Gun Class will be determined using the Lewis Classification System.

COMPETITIVE AIR RIFLE/SMALLBORE

We are on break during the month of August.

The Competitive Junior Air Rifle & Smallbore Program is for youth ages 12 to 18 and runs throughout most of the year. Each season begins in September on the first Monday following Labor Day (Sept. 8th, 2025). The program includes instruction on safe gun handling, the operation of both air rifles and small-bore rifles, and the fundamentals of Olympic Style three-position shooting. Practices are held from 6:15 to 8:30 p.m. on Mondays, with additional practices when necessary to prepare for competitions. The practices are held in the indoor pistol range. We also offer the opportunity to participate in clinics, leagues, and matches. Most matches are local, while some are out-of-state. The focus during practice is Air Rifle in the fall/winter, and Smallbore in the spring/summer. Match quality sporter and precision rifles, and ammunition are provided for use in the program. Each participant is asked to provide their own safety glasses and ear plugs. Registration is now open for the 2025-2026 season.
