

## Woods Walk - Example of Determining Lewis Classes and Place Awards

Using test data, the spreadsheet below provides sample results to illustrate how we determine Lewis Classes and Place Awards for the **Woods Walk Match**.

### Gun Classes

Three Gun Classes will be used:

- Centerfire Handguns with Iron Sights
- Centerfire Handguns with Red Dots
- Rimfire Handguns with Iron Sights or Red Dots

\$10 entry fee per gun (limit 2).

Each Gun Class is handled separately for awards.

In this example, all shooters are in **Centerfire Handguns with Iron Sights** Gun Class.

We use the rules below to determine Lewis Classes and Place Awards.

The same rules would be used to determine awards for the shooters in other Gun Classes.

### Number of Paid Shooters

We have **43** paid shooters shown, ranked in descending order by Score. Ties are shown in order of initial of First Name.

### Lewis Class Rules

For 1-10 shooters - Establish 1 Lewis Class - A

For 11-20 shooters - Establish 2 Lewis Classes - A, B

For 21-30 shooters - Establish 3 Lewis Classes - A, B, C

For 31-40 shooters - Establish 4 Lewis Classes - A, B, C, D

For 41-50 shooters - Establish 5 Lewis Classes - A, B, C, D, E

For 51-60 shooters - Establish 6 Lewis Classes - A, B, C, D, E, F

Since we have **43** shooters, we need to establish 5 Lewis Classes.

Divide 43 shooters by 5 to create groups for Lewis Classes A through E.

Since we have an odd number of shooters, the remainder goes into the last group (Lewis Class E).

Lewis Classes A through D contain 8 shooters. Lewis Class E contains 11.

### Place Award Rules

1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards normally go to the top 3 Shooters in each Lewis Class using a 50/30/20% split of their allocated Payout Pot.

Any tie scores split the award evenly.

Sometimes a particular Gun Class may not have many shooters in it, and only Lewis Class A is established. In such a case, if there are at least 3 shooters, the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards would go to the top 3 Shooters using a 50/30/20 split of the money in the allocated

Payout Pot. If there are only 2 shooters, 1st and 2nd Places are awarded using a 60/40% split of the money in the allocated Payout Pot. If only 1 shooter exists, 1st Place is awarded 100% of the allocated Payout Pot.

Tie score situations, which cross Lewis Class dividing lines, need to be addressed.

We have set up some examples below to illustrate how such ties are handled when determining Place Awards. See Comments for explanations.

## Awards

A minimum of 50% of entry fees received will be paid back to the shooters as cash awards.

The Place Award amounts are determined separately using our Lewis Class Payout Calculator, which is programmed with agreed-upon formulas to establish payout pots, and provide fair and balanced distribution of awards across all Lewis Classes.

Any ties for Place Awards are split evenly. Awards may be increased in order to be split evenly.

Cash awards are rounded to the nearest dollar to avoid using coins.

Certificates of Achievement are awarded to the Winners of each Gun Class.
