COMPETITIVE YOUTH BB GUN PROGRAM/TEAM

The BB Gun Program/Safety class will run Wednesday, October 19 through Wednesday, December 28, 2022. We meet every Wednesday and Friday between 10/19 and 11/18; Wednesdays between 11/30 and 12/21. Our program is primarily book work in October and November, then participants apply what they learned as they shoot the four competition positions. Each class builds on the previous class, so full participation is requested.

We meet in the indoor archery range from 6:30-8:30 p.m. and ask that participants and their adult (explained below) arrive by 6:15 p.m. The ages for this program are 8 through 15. For those wishing to participate on our competition team, practices will continue every Wednesday and Friday from January 4, 2023 through the end of April.

Shooters in this program have a coach on the line with them at all times. A parent (or another designated adult) fills the line coach role. Parents and coaches are required to participate in the above classes along with the shooters so proper coaching techniques can be learned. (Yes, we fully train all line coaches!)

Competitions are held February through April on various weekends around the midstate (within 2 hours of HH&A). There is always a possibility of attending Nationals in Rogers, Arkansas in July 2023 (if the team qualifies at the State match in April). This would extend practices for 7 members of our team through the date of Nationals (determined in February). Fundraising is necessary for this program, which can be found under CHAMPs in the newsletter.

COMPETITIVE AIR RIFLE/SMALLBORE

The Competitive Junior Air Rifle & Smallbore Program is for youth ages 12 to 18 and runs throughout most of the year. Each season begins in September, but the youth can join anytime throughout the year. The program includes instruction on safe gun handling, the operation of both air rifles and smallbore rifles, and the fundamentals of Olympic Style three-position shooting. Practices are held from 6:15 to 8:30 p.m. on Mondays, with additional practices when necessary to prepare for competitions. The practices are held in the indoor pistol range. We also offer the opportunity to participate in clinics, leagues, and matches. Most matches are local, while some are out-of-state.

The focus during practice is Air Rifle in the fall/winter, and Smallbore in the spring/summer. Match quality sporter and precision rifles, and ammunition are provided for use in the program. Each participant is asked to provide their own safety glasses and ear plugs.



CONCEALED CARRY RECIPROCITY

I have been asked about reciprocity agreements between PA and other states for Concealed Carry. It is important to know that no PA border state honors the PA Concealed Carry Permit except for West Virginia and Ohio.

The most current information concerning what states have reciprocity agreements with Pennsylvania is posted on the Attorney General's website. To access this information on their web site, select "Crime" and from the drop down box select "Firearm Reciprocity". From here you can view all the states that currently have reciprocity agreements with Pennsylvania along with a copy of the actual reciprocity agreements. All licenses issued by reciprocity states are recognized in Pennsylvania.

Other information included under "Firearm Reciprocity" is a list of states that allow individuals to carry concealed weapons in their state as long as they have a valid concealed weapons permit from their home state, regardless of whether or not there is a reciprocity agreement with that state. These states usually require the individual to have the actual permit and photo ID on their person while carrying the weapon. Note that to lawfully carry a concealed firearm in Pennsylvania, a person must either:

- 1. Possess a valid Pennsylvania License to Carry Firearms;
- 2. maintain residency in, and possess a valid license/permit to carry a firearm from a state with which Pennsylvania has a current reciprocity agreement, or;
- 3. fall within the applicable exceptions in 18 Pa. C.S. §6106(2)(b) as listed above, including §6106(2)(b)(15) regarding licenses/permits to carry a firearm recognized under Pennsylvania law without a formal reciprocity agreement.

For a list of the state licenses/permits recognized by the Attorney General under §6106(2)(b)(15), and for additional information contact the Office of the Attorney General, PA Office of Attorney General. Keep in mind that laws for various states can change so it is important to be current when traveling with a firearm.

Ten-Four Trivia

10-4 Day is a way of saying "message received" in radio communications and also used as a way to say "you got it." It was invented by the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials-International (APCO). The ten-codes are credited to Illinois State Police Communications Director Charles Hopper who created them between 1937–40 for use in radio communications among cops. The use of the number 10 before all of the codes was another workaround. It took a split second for the motorgenerator in the radios to warm up, and so the first syllables of a radio transmission were often lost. The 10 was used as a placeholder to give the motor-generator time to speed up enough to hear the second part of the code. 4 was simply chosen to mean "acknowledgement" of a message (10-3 meant "stop transmitting" in case you wanted to know). 
