Vice-President's Pen

.22 Youth Range

Thanks to John Glatz and others, your club now has a .22 Youth Range. This range is for youth only with adult supervision. The rules are as follows.

Range is restricted to Rifle or Handgun only, .22 caliber.

Empty Chamber Indicators required for benched firearms.

Youth shooters must be supervised and accompanied by an adult member.

Firearms must be pointed in a safe direction at all times.

No steel targets other than what the club provides.

Range is shared with the shotgun patterning range. Shotgun patterning range has priority. No gun handling while someone is forward of either range firing line.

Eye and ear protection is required for everyone, shooters and non shooters.

Firearms must be unloaded until ready to fire.

No shooting outside the left or right range limits.

Do not park vehicles on the range while shooting.

Do not shoot targets with a shotgun. BE SAFE AND ENJOY THE NEW RANGE.

INDOOR NOVELTY SHOOTS

We will be holding our 2022 winter Novelty Shoots at the Indoor Pistol Range on the following Sundays, from 1:00 p.m. to approximately 3:30 p.m., using handguns:

February 13 - .22 Rimfire Match

March 13 - Centerfire Match, using .380, 9mm, or .38 caliber (Note: Rimfire is welcome, but Centerfire scores better!)

As usual, we will be shooting paper Luck Targets (e.g., poker cards, random numbers, bowling pins, coins, pool balls, dart boards, bullseyes, etc.) at 50 feet. Revolvers and semi-autos may be used.

Red dots are allowed. No holster required. Two-hand hold is ok. Usually 5 shots per target per relay, and about 8 relays.

Cost is \$2 per relay, with a 50% payback to the shooters using the Lewis Classification System. Shoot as many relays as you like.

First-time shooters are WELCOME and our matches are open to the public. Come on out and join us for some fun, and bring a shooting friend with you.

HI POWER RIFLE CLASS

There will be a Hi Power Rifle Class on April 2, 2022 at the HHA clubhouse and 100 yard range. This High Power Rifle Orientation class introduces new shooters to basic rifle safety, basic rifle handling, and basic rifle shooting skills using the AR-15 rifle. This class is designed to introduce new shooters to safely compete in an NRA sponsored High Power Rifle Match. This class uses lecture and practical, hands-on exercises for the training sessions. PICK UP YOUR BRASS THIS IS A RANGE RULE!

HH&A members are reminded that the board of directors have adopted Ground Rules and Range Regulations that govern the use of facilities on the property. General Rule # 5 states: <u>"Firing Lines and Tar-</u> gets must be cleaned up after use, including the plinking range."

Failure to pick up your brass is a VIOLATION of this rule. It can also pose a safety hazard. This problem has surfaced recently, especially on the outdoor Bullseye and PPC Ranges. While the board acknowledges that every single piece of brass cannot be picked up, members MUST make a best effort to police their mess! Failure to do so is considered a range rule violation just like any other. You will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including membership termination.

Finally, you are also reminded that a small group of dedicated volunteers sort the picked-up brass and prepare it to sell to reloaders and the rest is brought to a recycling center. The proceeds are used to support our outstanding youth programs.

HHA LAW + REGULATORY REPORT (12.3.2021)

Club member and attorney George Bibikos keeps tabs on legal developments that may be of interest to HHA and its members. Here's the latest:

California Gun Law Upheld. In a 7-4 vote, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that limits on largescale magazines under a California law do not violate the Second Amendment right to bear arms nor does the law limit the ability to defend oneself. The ruling supports the constitutionality of California laws that ban magazines holding 10 or more rounds of ammunition. The court's decision may end up before the United States Supreme Court. CLUB INSIGHTS

As a new member, I sometimes wondered <u>why</u> certain range rules existed. I've come to learn there's good reasons for each of them. Here's insight into a couple.

One target per stand on the rifle ranges – More targets crowd to the edge of the backer. This increases the chances of a round hitting the wood target frame. It can only take one hit to splinter the frame into pieces. Then it needs rebuilt or replaced. We do dozens of these per year which costs your club money for materials and volunteer time to do the work. Metal target stands are even more expensive to repair or replace.

No silhouette targets on the indoor pistol range – This comes down to geometry. If the target is close, and the shot is high but still on the target, the round can hit the range ceiling and not the back-stop. Low shots bounce off the floor. Side shots hit the posts. All are dangerous and destructive. So using only bullseye targets -- which are much smaller than silhouettes -- reduces the chances of damaging errant shots.

Bottom line – It's your responsibility to know the range rules and follow them. If you don't understand, ask. The range rules keep us safe. They also reduce damage to club property which in turn helps keep membership dues low. See you at the club.

We will have one relay for return shooters beginning around 5:45 pm. Return shooters do not need to pre-register, just show up at least 15 minutes before the relay and come to the range.

- If a previous year's junior member is 16 as of January 1, they must renew as a separate member. This includes children that are part of a family membership.
- If you do not renew your membership by December 31, your privileges to use any club facilities will be suspended (card keys will be disabled) until your renewal is received and processed. Allow at least two weeks to receive your membership card after we receive your renewal.
- ADULT: 22-61 years, JUNIOR: up to 15 years, YOUNG ADULT: 16-21 years, SENIOR: 62 years and older (ages as of Jan. 1).


