As we start the new year, I would like to remind everyone that before you come to the club, read and understand the range rules of the range you intend to use. Violations of club and safety rules could result in termination.

There are cameras at all ranges for your safety.

There have been increasing instances of members using the ranges after sunset. Remember sunset changes every day and it is NOT when you can't see any more!!! Know the exact time of sunset on the day you are at the range.

Also, with the advent of revolvers chambered in 410 on the market, we have noticed more use of these guns in the indoor range.

Starting immediately, the use of 410 gauge ammo of ANY type is prohibited inside the indoor range. This ammo causes increased damage to the bullet trap.

Remember to read and UNDERSTAND the range rules BEFORE going to the range. If you have any questions, please ask.

JUNIOR RIFLE PROGRAM

Junior Rifle starts Thursday, January 5th, 2017 and is open to all youth 11 to 18 years old. This program is open to the public. The club provides rifles, ammo and learning materials free of charge. Class consists of classroom and range time each week. Please bring your own eye and ear protection. Course will run for a minimum of 10 weeks, every Thursday night beginning at 6:30 pm.

NOVELTY SHOOTS

We will be holding our winter Novelty Shoots at the indoor pistol range on the following Sundays, from 1:00 pm to 3:30 pm, using handguns:

As usual, we will be shooting paper Luck Targets (e.g., poker cards, random numbers, bowling pins, coins, pool balls, dart boards, bullseyes, etc.) at 50 feet. Revolvers and semi-autos may be used. Red dots are allowed. No holster required. Two-hand hold is ok. Usually 5 shots per target per relay, and about 8 relays.

Cost is \$2 per relay, with a 50% payback to the shooters using the Lewis Classification System. Shoot as many relays as you like.

We are working on prizes for the contest. INDOOR PISTOL RANGE RULES REMINDER

A few members have been using B27 or other full body sized targets on the Indoor Pistol Range. Targets of this size are not allowed on the Indoor Pistol range for safety reasons. The only time they are allowed on this range is for approved and sanctioned training events such as the Handgun Safety Classes and Law Enforcement training. If you have any doubt about what targets you are allowed to use, check the by-laws or read the sign posted in the range lobby.

ADVANCED HANDGUN CLASSES

Advanced handgun classes are scheduled throughout the year and are offered based on the demand of club members. In the Defensive Skills class, we teach levels of awareness, defensive mindset and the basic techniques of defensive shooting (double and triple taps, speed reloads and clearing malfunctions). In Personal Protection in the Home course, students learn about cover and concealment and are trained to shoot from behind barriers in various positions. The Concealed Carry class teaches students to safely draw and holster both with and without a concealment garment. The Personal Protection Outside the Home is offered in two phases: the basic and the advanced courses. Students will learn advanced shooting techniques, i.e. moving, turning, low light conditions, as well as further legal information.

MEMBERSHIP CARDS AND GUEST PASSES

Membership cards **MUST** be displayed while using any club range. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Similarly, if you bring a guest, they **MUST** display a guest pass. Again, **NO EXCEPTIONS.** These rules help us all by ensuring our club is safely and responsibly enjoyed by **ONLY** our members and attended guests. These rules also mean that you must plan ahead to obtain a guest pass. Guest passes may be purchased for \$10.00 from:

You must have your membership card with you when purchasing guest passes. Remember, if you're found with a guest using the ranges without a pass your membership can be terminated.

Special Notice

Significant improvements are being made to the earth backstops for the 25/50-yard, 100-yard, and outdoor pistol ranges. This ongoing work may happen on any day and is not scheduled ahead of time. Therefore, it cannot be reflected in this Range Events Schedule.

Please expect that until this work is completed, you might have to change your plans upon arriving at the club. For instance, you might be able to use the 25/50-yard range but not the 100-yard. Or you might have to wait until the work is completed for the day. Or you might not be able to shoot on any of these ranges. The workers continue to only close the ranges necessary to keep them safe. Be patient and expect delays.

As always, range safety comes first. Please show the workers the safety and courtesy they deserve. Thanks.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL FORM, DUE BEFORE JANUARY 1

- This form can **only** be used if you are **renewing a membership**. If you were a member in the past 2 years, you may use this form; otherwise, you must use a New Member Application form to obtain membership.
- If changing from an Adult to Family membership, please use a New Member Application form and follow the instructions.
- If a previous year's junior member is 16 as of January 1, they must renew as a separate member. This includes children that are part of a family membership.
- **If you do not renew your membership by December 31, your privileges to use any club facilities will be suspended (card keys will be disabled) until your renewal is received and processed. Allow at least two weeks to receive your membership card after we receive your renewal.**
- ADULT: 22-61 years, JUNIOR: up to 15 years, YOUNG ADULT: 16-21 years, SENIOR: 62 years and older (ages as of Jan. 1).
- Make checks payable to HH&A. Applicant will be responsible for all bank fees for a check returned for any reason.

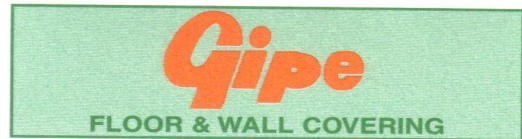
